IN RETROSPECT

This past year has been a particularly happy time for the North Fork Community Theatre. Little theatre groups have eternal wishes and dreams that are perhaps not too often fulfilled. A constant one is to own a theatre or more simply, to "have a home". Due to the kindness of many, many people in this community you are enjoying our third performance of the 1961-1962 season in our permanent home. Henceforth all our major productions, workshops, and meetings will be held in this building. Heartfelt thanks are extended to all who made this possible and a sincere welcome to everyone to join in our activities.

Recognition for artistic achievement also gladdens the hearts of amateur theatre groups. This past year, The News-Review and Sunday Review of Riverhead initiated the George Spelvin Awards for excellence in Eastern Suffolk Theatre. The North Fork Community Theatre received six awards, four of which were won by our October presentation, THE GLASS MENAGERIE. This play was voted best production (Jack Moffat), Best director (Fred Newell), Best supporting actress (Bente Snellenburg), Best lighting (Sydney Breese). Joan Smith received the best actress award for her role in our production of "Born Yesterday", and Maureen Moffat for her role in "The Boy Friend" as best local actress in a summer show. It should also be noted here that James Moreno's summer theatre won two awards, a special one we heartily endorse, for bringing new theatre activity to this area, and also best production in summer stock for "Dark at the Top of the Stairs".

Still another dream is the "Standing Room Only" sign. Our first musical, "Guys and Dolls", played to a full house for six performances. We are grateful to all who supported our venture into musical comedy and would also like to thank our own membership for their long hours of rehearsal and the resulting show which brigh-

tened the winter season on Eastern Long Island.

This year we have also introduced a policy whereby we can help local organizations in their fund-raising attempts. For each show we will sell tickets at a discount to one organization for resale at full price. We are pleased to find this mutually beneficial and that your community theatre can thusly serve worthy causes in the community.

The members of the North Fork Community Theatre contribute much time and talent to the production of live theatre for this area, but we realize how impossible this would be twithout your support. We could not possibly list each and every person who has aided us in this endeavor, but we would like to mention a few and extend our gratitude to: those who so kindly advertised in our program, the local newspapers, the librarians, Mr. Joseph Snellenburg, Mr. James Moreno, The Mattituck Fire Department, The Southold Town Police, Junior Order American Mechanics, Roy H.
