

THE BIRTH OF A MUSICAL

"Which came first, the chicken or the egg?" I can remember so well the trustration I telt as a child when my namesake Dr. Stokes asked me that question. I've been reminded of the incident so otten since I wrote THE PEANUT BUTTER PRINCE because people have been asking me, "Which do you write first — the words, the music, or the play?" And the answer is rather like the chicken and the egg —sometimes one, sometimes another, sometimes all at the same time.

When I decided to write THERE COMES A TIME, I had three pieces to start with: a story idea, a few melodies I had jotted down in a notebook, and two complete songs. This story would be tor adults, not children — no witches or dragons this time. I knew that the characters in the musicals I had seen who were most real and most interesting were older. In GUYS AND DOLLS Adelaide has Sarah beat by miles, I'll take Meg instead of Lola any day in DAMN YANKEES, and Eliza may be MY FAIR LADY, but I think Higgins steals the show.

I had about a dozen melodies, but I knew that if I wanted a show with twenty songs I'd have to write thirty more to get the right twenty. The two songs I had could probably be used. And from these

three pieces came THERE COMES A TIME.

It was fun to watch it grow — each of the pieces giving birth to other pieces until there was a complete show. One of the songs I already had was about a man who had never really been in love — a kind of man's torch song. That gave me the main character — the older bachelor who is the ultimate challenge to every woman, but who has never been caught. Who might catch a man like that? I myself am very attracted by the women who have never married and who seem to be so warm and loving and kind and beautiful that I wonder how they could possibly have been passed by. Perhaps they loved once and were too hurt to ever love again. From this idea came Helen Wrightson and a haunting ballad, "I Found Him in the Summertime."

One catchy piece of melody suggested the words "no one ever married me", and I thought how funny it is to watch the gals who chase the boys so furiously that they scare them away — and wouldn't it be fun to watch one chase a very shy and proper young man. Thus Charlotte and Freddy, and with some adjustments in the lyrics, "I Am

Ready Now."

But where would a group like this ever meet? I remember the weekend Maureen and I went skiing in the Poconos — and remember that funny bell boy at Split Rock Lodge? And remember that funny story about Mrs. Zeese's nephew who worked at a summer resort and had to be available for the unattached ladies? I could have a song about —

I still don't know which came first — the chicken or the egg — or the words, the music, or the play. But I had a lot of fun watching THERE COMES A TIME come to be, and I hope that you enjoy watching it in February.
