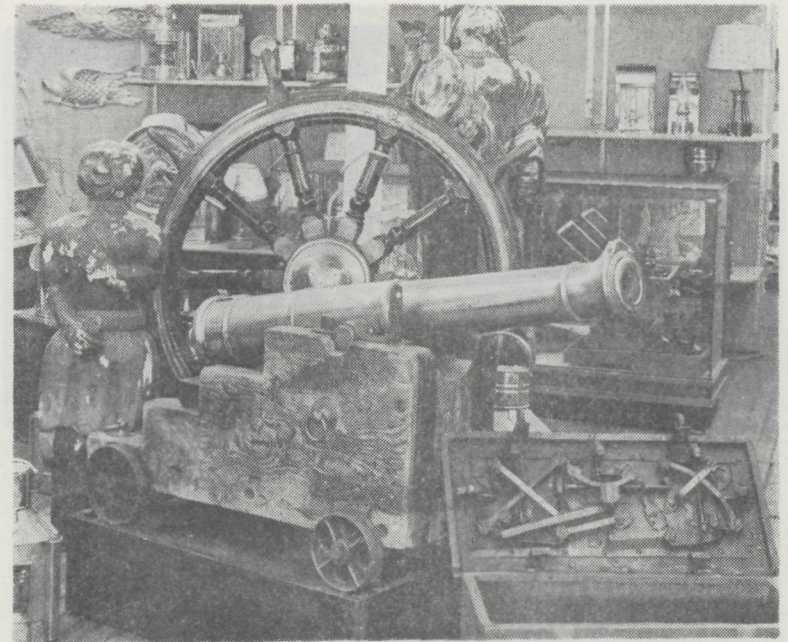

The opening of the Long Island Festival Repertory at the Mineola Playhouse and the expansion of the Gateway Playhouse in Bellport have called forth appeals to attend their performances and subscribe to their entire season's work. What seems to be overlooked is that some of us on the North Fork have been enjoying such "cultural" benefits for at least the past 10 years as we supported the local community theatre.

We have every intention of supporting the new ventures in Bellport and Mineola because we believe every bit of theatre on Long Island should be encouraged. But we also will continue to support the community theatres much closer to home and especially the North Fork Community Theatre because to us anyway it practically is home.

Actually, the NFCT has lived a robust life since 1957, producing 31 plays, two of them original musicals written by a member, giving benefit performances to assist local organizations, providing a showcase for the talents of artists, musicians and craftsmen of all types, and serving as a social meeting place for many residents who, weary of TV watching and the canned emotions one gets on a screen, crave live companionship.

The NFCT has enjoyed the support of local newspapers and has gratefully received picture coverage by many of them. This is essential to the healthy growth of such an organization. The program booklet is a constant reminder of the support local businessmen give to cultural activities on Long Island.

We do not expect that such new ventures as the expanded programs of theatres west of us will have a large effect on the North Fork except to promote more theatre going, and we're all for that. We are certainly not minimizing their beneficial effects on Long Island "culture", but we do sometimes wonder why distance makes the hearts of editorial writers grow fonder.

When the actors and production staffers you're enjoying tonight or the ones you saw earlier this season aren't putting on plays, how do they keep themselves busy? Of course, all the men and half the women have full time jobs, and most are devoted parents of children who demand attention. However, to the NFCT member the community is important. There follows a sampling of some "outside" interests.

A few members get politically involved: some working with the League of Women Voters and some actively stating their philosophies by working on the "Citizens for Pike" committee.

The two local hospitals, Eastern Long Island in Greenport and Central Suffolk in Riverhead, gain the help of many members. Some work as Pink Ladies or nurses' aides, some in the gift or coffee shops, and a great many work at fund raising activities.

Scouting gets its share of attention: there's a scout master or two and endless den mothers and that Girl Scout cookie sale gets

help from others. There are a few who serve as firemen, and others who raise funds for local community chests, the USO, the Cancer and Heart Funds, or the Red Cross.

Church work seems the most popular of all volunteer efforts. Many NFCT members enjoy participating in their church choirs, some as soloists or directors, others just as singing members. All church societies seem to have a representative and hardly a bake, rummage, or yard sale is held without a helping NFCT hand. Numerous bridge parties, church social dances, even cocktail parties are hostess-ed by members. One even made habits for several nuns.


Young people's groups seem to draw a great many theatre members into leadership positions. Some are chairmen of youth groups, directing and organizing all activities, for a whole year; others teach classes once a week; two accompany young singers at guitar Masses; and one spends hours directing a CYO athletic program.

The local libraries all are benefited by the work of some members, by those who work at clerical tasks in the library and those who help raise money at teas and book sales.

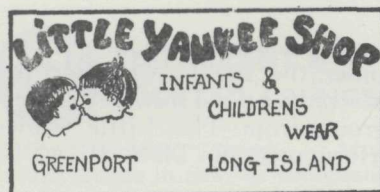
