

Hal's first role was that of Parker Ballantine in "Critic's Choice", which was followed by the stern minister in "The Crucible", the demanding Fred Petruccio role in "Kiss Me Kate", haunted James in "The Potting Shed", debonair prime minister in "Call Me Madam", mysterious Paul in last year's "There Comes a Time", and the charming wife-throttler, Jules, in "My Three Angels".

Outside the theatre Hal is well known as the designer and builder of many of the most beautiful homes on this end of the island. His design artistry and construction ability have also resulted in some stunning sets for NFCT productions and an appropriately lovely cover for the "She Loves Me" program.

ART WILKS (Bronny) Yes, it's him again. He is in another play. Well, what could we do? He did try out, he does fall down rather well, he knew the lines; and after all, he is the President. He is going to take leave of the stage for the next play ("Bell, Book and Candle") and do the lights, something he has wanted to do for quite a while.

Art is one of our character actors, (sometimes that is called type-casting) and Bronny is his favorite character. He feels that Bronny is the type of person who is close to being just what he always wanted to be when he was a kid. (Now you know why he tried out). Bronny is the kid who never quite grew up, or the adult who hasn't become spoiled by the rest of the adults in the world. He is first and foremost sincere, dependable, a worry wart but a friend to the end. (Gulp) This is the second time that Art has been Bronny, (or maybe it is Bronny that has been Art). Art feels that very few parts offer an entrance as good as this one. Let's hope he doesn't end up in your lap.



THE AUTHOR TELLS HOW IT HAPPENED

The Peanut Butter Prince was great fun to write because I had no idea what I was doing. I knew what a finished musical should be, but other than some long-forgotten essays about what professionals do and a year of piano lessons, I didn't know where to begin.

It seemed that writing for children would make inventing the story easier (I am not inventive), and so when I sat down to write some tunes, I had in mind that they would be tunes for children's stories characters — a king, a queen, a prince, a princess, and probably a witch. The first tune was "In the Twilight", an imitation of the simple waltz melody Snow White sang. "The Witch's Brew" grew out of an improvisation of a piano exercise in my son's second grade piano book. Before I started the story, I had about fifteen tunes, some of which by their sound suggested first lines — first lines that one of the characters might be expected to say.

Then came the story. How to begin? I remembered the funny bit in Critic's Choice about how authors use servants to explain their stories. And so the King opens the play talking with a servant. What should they talk about? Maureen was very busy with the VISTA Sponsoring Committee that summer — part of the poverty program —hence QUISA and servants who could be "a little more equal than we used to be."

What kind of characters? People have been telling me for years that I take things too seriously. So why not have a worried king and let the prince be the epitome of the opposite, and toss in a bit of good Christian "lilies of the field" philosophy too?

The queen? You can imagine what Maureen must have to be to live with "too serious" me. Where did Hepzi come from? I loved Joan Smith as Billie Dawn in Born Yesterday and her bit of "Anything Goes." You will notice that Hepzi sounds a lot more like Billie Dawn at the beginning of the story. Hepzi grew into another person, but I didn't rewrite her earlier scenes. Now you know where the prince got his name.

The story was such fun because it seemed to tell itself. I couldn't wait to see what happened. When I got half way through the dragon scene, however, (Cyril Richard as Captain Hook) I realized the story was almost over, and I was having too much fun to stop. Besides I had all those tunes that seemed too good to throw away. A slight complication of plot and there was a second act.



The biggest problem of the finished story was that Bronny was not a complete character. One of his songs called "Leapin Lizards" didn't particularly please anybody, but it did explain his character. The song was replaced, and a little rewriting keeping the old song in mind brought Bronny into focus.

The title and the final song happened just the way anyone would imagine. I had tried to have a variety of tempos and rhythms, and just before lunch I had jotted down the melody line for a march. It's obvious what happened. My first reaction was similar to the way one reacts to a parody — isn't this silly. It certainly was. But serious me knew it was a part of what I was trying to say too — that magic is available to everybody — all you have to have is a happy heart.

With so many borrowed (stolen?) bits and pieces, it is no wonder that I have never felt like a creative artist about **The Prince**. I am just very, very fond of the characters I met during the summer of 1965. And I get a tremendous pleasure from knowing that so many people like my friends.

THE AUTHOR'S WIFE TELLS ABOUT LIFE WITH A PRINCE

Once upon a summertime in Southold by the Sound, a certain gentleman said to his wife, "I think I'll write a musical for the NFCT." Then he sat down at the piano for three-quarters of an hour and composed eleven songs.

It sounds like a fairy tale, but it's true. The tunes fairly tumbled out, some to be discarded, some to be polished, and some were just

right as they were.

Each night the children willingly deserted television to hear more about the Happy Prince who became the Unaccomplished Prince who turned out to be the Peanut Butter Prince. They talked about it, gave helpful hints, asked a thousand questions. Their glee listening to "Mischief" and their squirms over "Witch's Brew" egged their father on.

Now and then there was a slight snag or two. Several people suffered terribly upon being faced with the question, "What rhymes with tiger?" Ogden Nash solved the problem by mispronouncing Niger, but a more perfect rhyme has yet to be found, so the dragon who was going to be "fierce as a tiger" became "fierce and ferocious."

After a while, friends who had heard bits of the music, a few lyrics and some snatches of the story were, by being wined and dined (I cooked for THE PEANUT BUTTER PRINCE!), conned into taking parts and reading the drafts aloud. Their responses and suggestions were weighed by the author and his excessively vocal spouse. One of the things which continually amused me was the way we all talked about the characters as though we were discussing real people. We became positively fierce defending a favorite character. Somehow lack managed to satisfy everyone's feelings.

I became thoroughly engrossed in the lovely warm world Jack made live. The characters became so real to me. The lovely, slightly goofy, very gallant Queen who succumbed only, and momentarily, to tired feet is very dear. My friend the King is more truly a man because he knows his limitations. I sympathize with his desire to relax and enjoy life, and I admire his dedication to his job even though it drives him to be nearly as hard on those he loves as he is on himself. The Witch (I secretly named her Prudence), Hepzi, and Bronny are so satisfactory to all my rowdy instincts. They're harmless safety valves, precious and necessary. The Prince soothes me

and fortifies my faith and trust. The sweet, troubled Princess wrings my heart with her tears, and I rejoice in her good fortune. Then there's my darling Dragon, all menace and shout but tipped over into affection by so frivolous a thing as a dance. Conquered so gently, he is a symbol of my worst nightmares miraculously turned into guardian angels.

As Jack wrote The Prince, I was continually thrilled by the joy it gave him. He still seems unable to believe he did it. He said once that it came so easily he thought some spirit had dictated it to him. I think not.

The most marvelous thing of all is something I call "the PBP Effect," a lovely warm glow of enthusiasm which shines from everyone connected with the show. The facial muscles of crew and cast will be very sore by closing night—they all come in smiling, work smiling, and leave smiling. It's wonderful.

If I sound like Happy Prince Harry, blame it on Jack. His work gives me wings, and I'm overjoyed to be a part of it. I'm just the tiniest bit prejudiced, but I think he's GREAT.
