Thanks to the inherent appeal in any lovable stage lunatic, coupled with tremendous skill and vivacity of the lady enacting the part, "Auntie Mame" had no trouble becoming the season's favorite popular comedy. Adapted from a sophisticated comic strip; and the adapters, doubtless wisely, went in for a kind of scene-a-minute technique. Their slapdash method, if wholly uncreative, did manage to make speed a kind of substitute for wit: all these quick-changes went well with Auntie Mame's own scatterbrained nature, and in the theatre allowed for a splendid succession of new costumes, hair-dos wall-treatments, gaffes, predicaments, and men.

move was made to Mattituck and the opening play was "The Glass Menagerie". Since then the building has been used for all NFCT productions. Improvements have been made in the seats, the light board and most recently a new sound system.

Besides the NFCT, the building has been used for performances by the National Humanities Series. These programs are put on by small groups of actors and musicians sent around the country to present special readings, skits and folk singing on themes of the humanities. The subject of one presentation in the theatre was "Justice" which included historical skits and readings and included a discussion with audience on their views of the subject and the material that had been presented.

Most recently, Youth On Stage, a group of about 60 high school and college age young people presented the very successful musical production of "The Music Man". This show was done last summer under the direction of Maureen Cahill and was entirely produced, built and costumed by the kids involved. It was a huge success and gave a real program of satisfying activity to a large group of teenagers. The NFCT membership helped and the original financing was underwritten by the group. The proceeds went to other youth projects and we can only hope that next summer another show will be on the boards.



BESIDES THE ACTORS

Besides the actors and the director who are the more visible members of the NFCT, please consider the fact that each play has a full page of names in the program devoted to the production staff. All of them work hard, have important jobs and have to have their parts done as surely as do those who appear on the stage under the lights. In future programs we hope to tell you more about the backstage crews. Who they are, what the jobs are and how the people who fill them go about them. Maybe instead of acting a new member would be interested in less visible activity. The back stage has room for all.

At the top of the list are the assistant director and the stage manager. These two have an extra responsibility in making the show go. The assistant director as it has evolved in NFCT is primarily the prompter, the one who sits in the dark at the edge of the stage and follows all the lines; ready to assist an actor who misses a cue or forgets a line. It is a delicate task to know when one actor needs help and when another will really come through if given a few more moments to gather the thoughts.

The stage manager works with the movement of sets on and off the stage, makes sure the actors are at the right entrances and that the props, lights and sound systems are ready to go. He is in charge when the play is on. He controls the curtain, when it is going up and when it comes down. Actors wandering off must be called when its their turn to come on. Others must be gotten off stage when they may be in the way of the crew. In more professional operations the stage manager calls the rehearsals, has a good deal to do with the setting up of the stage and sees that the various crews have their jobs done on time when the rehearsal schedule moves to them.

The other departments of stage craft, set construction, design, and decoration; lighting, sound, costumes, make-up, and props all have their special tasks and more about them at another time.
