BIOGRAPHIES

BOB ACKROYD (Director and Richard) is president of Ackroyd Creative Services. He lives in Mattituck with his wife, Cindy and their three children. Bob also directed our memorable production of The Lion In Winter. He was last seen as the preacher in Dark Of The Moon.

JOHN ASHTON (Sam Adams) is a banker who lives in Mattituck with his wife and three children. This is John's ninth appearance on our stage. He has also been active in the East End Theatre Guild, the New Vic Repertory, and the Stirling Players. John completed a professional acting course at the PAF Playhouse in Huntington.

SYD BREESE (Gov. Hutchinson) has been a member of the NFCT since the beginning. He has done every job there is to do in the theatre except act -- this is his debut.

BILL BURGESS (James Otis and Josiah) We are sorry to announce that this is Bill's last performance for us at the NFCT because he and his family are off to New Orleans in the near future. We shall miss him and Billie and Belinda very much.

DAVID DETRICH (Roger and Rev. Mayhew) has been active in character roles, stage managing and other backstage roles since the 1964 production of The Crucible. David is also a past president of NFCT.

BOB FREEMAN (Author, Gov. Bernard and Capt. Parker) lives in Riverhead with his wife, Janet and Christopher. He teaches English at West Islip High School.

JANET FREEMAN (Producer) lives in Riverhead with Bob and Christopher. Janet's primary responsibility for this show was costumes, which was the biggest job in the show.

DICK KEOGH (Dr. Warren) is a member of the Board of Directors of the NFCT. This is his first appearance on stage.

DAVID MARKEL (John Hancock) is a veteran of the NFCT stage. He will be directing our next production -- Of Thee I Sing.

STEVE McCONNELL (William and Editor Gill) is a new member of the NFCT. He lives in Southold with his wife and two children. Steve is the new owner of the Gifts & Goodies and Gadgets Shop on the North Road in Southold.

ANNE O'DONOHOE is a former Manhattanite and theatre buff now residing in Laurel. She is a new member of the NFCT. This is her first time on stage.

ART QUINTANA (John Adams) is a veteran of five NFCT productions. He lives in East Marion with his wife and five children.
