

#### Biographies

Herman Otter (Mr. Patterson) — Not only is this Herman's first time with the NFCT, this is also his first stage experience. Herman works on Plum Island and is a member of the National Guard.

**Deborah Pinneo** (Miss Swift) — The biggest little person that has ever happened to the NFCT. Debbie enjoys sunshine, flowers, people, and life in general. She first appeared in *Teahouse of the August Moon* and now enjoys having lines that the audience can understand. And we enjoy having this ray of sunshine around once again.
