JAN ANGELO (Old Woman's Daughter)—Jan is a graduate of Southeastern Massachusetts University, and is an agent with Burt G. Lewis Realty. Women's Studies and Organic Gardening are subjects of interest and research to her.

JOHN OLIVER ASHTON (Col. Purdy)—John is returning to the NFCT after a four year absence. He last appeared as Sir Thomas More in A Man for All

Seasons. This marks John's 14th appearance on our stage.

ANNETTE BEDNOSKY (Villager)—Annette is a 15 year old sophomore at Southold High School. Although this is her first time on stage, she has worked backstage on Once Upon a Mattress and The Boyfriend. She has taken acting and mime classes, loves art, cheerleading, cute guys, and cleaning cages at a nearby

animal hospital.

DAVID CARLSON (Mr. Seiko)—At age 17, this is David's fifth theatrical production. His previous encounters with the stage include Annie Get Your Gun and the title role in Finian's Rainbow. During the past two summers, he has participated in the NFCT's productions of Once Upon a Mattress and The Boyfriend. David is a senior at Hampton Bays High School.

JED CLAUSS (Mr. Hokaida)—Jed, aka Jedediah Spelvin, took this role to learn Sumo wrestlers' trick moves to be practiced on his wife, Joanna, when the show ends. His favorite pastime during this show has been wrestling with Lady

Astor.

JACK CONFORTI (Sgt. Gregovich)—Jack has progressed from playing a green bad guy (L'il Abner) to a singing Child of God (Godspell) to a fun fur freak (Applause) to a tango dancer (The Boyfriend) to this! He can still be found in his longest running act at Woolco in Riverhead.

MICHAEL CONFORTI (Ancient Man)—Mike is growing up at the NFCT. When he was eight, it was school plays (Applause) and during boarding school he starred at the school dances (The Boyfriend). And now that he's all grown up he's

hitching rides on the back of Jeeps! Now who's got who's goat?

GLEN HOLTZER (Capt. Fisby)—Glen is new to this area from Washington, D. C. where he spent the last year studying with the Arena Stage Actor's Workshop and the Joy Zinoman Studio Theatre. While appearing on stage he earned his living on the air in Washington radio. He can now be heard locally every morning from 6-10 on WRCN-FM.

KAREN HORVATH (Child)—Karen, a 6th grader at the Cutchogue East School, is 12 years old. This is her first play at the NFCT. She loves cats and

singing.

BRIAN HUNT (Villager)—A 6th grader at the Oak Elementary School in Southold, Brian likes horseback riding, soccer, and playing the saxophone.

BRITTANIA HUNT (Lady Astor)—Although she doesn't look it, Brit is only 4 years old. She is five months pregnant and, last year, had triplets. For 8 months of the year, she is a large milk producer. Brit loves eating hay, chewing wood, and climbing—and her favorite snack is paper! This pure-bred Alpen dairy goat has never appeared on stage before but she takes direction beautifully!

JOHN H. JACKSON (Mr. Keora)—John has appeared in six productions with us since 1977 including *The Pirates of Penzance*. He has also performed with Opera on the Sound and is currently a member of the Bridgehampton Choral

Society. John works as a home care cosmetologist.

KATHRYN H. KING (Old Woman)—Teahouse is Kathy's 3rd show at the NFCT. The only reason that she joined the cast was to learn Okinawan. It helps to

be bilingual.

PAUL LAMBERT (Villager)—Teahouse is Paul's second appearance on the NFCT stage. Last summer he appeared in the Youth Players' production of The Boyfriend. Paul hopes to continue to act with us - and we hope that he will too. MICHAEL LOSQUADRO (Sakini)—Although new to the NFCT, Michael has appeared many times with Theatre Three, Act I Workshop, BNL Theater, and Playcrafters. Michael lives in Eastport with his wife, Marie, and daughter, Kristin, and works at Brookhaven Labs fixing computers.

JOHN NORMOYLE (Villager)—John has appeared with the Youth Players in Once Upon a Mattress and The Boyfriend. As a student at Hampton Bays High School, he has also been seen in Annie Get Your Gun and Finian's Rainbow.

JACQUELYN JAMES OSTUNI (Lotus Blossom)—Jacquie has flowered in her short time with us. As a drunk in *Three for Gin* and an ambitious actress in *Applause*, she has danced, sung, and made us cookies. She is a professional actress, model and entertainer, has worked in summer stock, clubs, and dinner theater, is married and the mother of another professional actor and model. And, believe it or not, she didn't speak a word of Okinawan before this show started.

PAUL PELIS (Mr. Omura)—Teahouse is Paul's 2d appearance on the NFCT stage. He made his debut in last summer's The Boyfriend. He has performed in Annie Get Your Gun, Oliver, and Finian's Rainbow. Paul finds the part of Mr. Omura very relaxing after a grueling world tour starring in South Pacific.

DEBORAH E. PINNEO (Villager)—This is Deborah's debut at the NFCT. Look forward to seeing her charming little face here again and again. Her vibrant personality appeared in her college performance of *Jesus Christ Superstar*.

ERIC PYLKO (Child)—Eric is a 6th grader in the East Cutchogue School. He enjoys soccer, electronic games, and can do the Rubik's Cube in 88 seconds.

LIZ SIECZKA (Villager)—Liz is 14 and a freshman at Mattituck High School. Her family just moved here this summer from Ithaca, N. Y. This is Liz's first appearance at the NFCT and, hopefully, not her last.

MICHAEL SIECZKA (Villager)—Mike is 13 and in the 8th grade at

Mattituck High School. This is also his debut at the NFCT.

MICHELE SILIRIS (Villager)—At 18 years of age, this is Michele's debut with us also. She has been involved in a theatre workshop with Peg Murray and, while finishing school in South Carolina, played Margaret "Hot Lips" Houlihan in the play M*A*S*H. She would like to become a professional actress.

MARK SISSON (Capt. McLean)—A Riverhead resident, Mark has participated in several NFCT productions including Godspell and The Fantasticks. In February, he will produce The Desperate Hours with Chris Conforti directing. See

ANGELO TRUGLIO (Mr. Sumata)—Angelo resides in Southold. He first appeared with the NFCT in last spring's production of Applause. Angelo thoroughly enjoys the theater and its inhabitants, dabbles in photography and gardening when he is not setting the educational world afire.

CYNTHIA TULEJA (Miss Higa Jiga)—Cynthia, a graduate of The National Theatre Institute and The Actors Institute, first appeared with us as the mute in

The Fantasticks.

DIANE WATSON (Villager)—Diane is a refugee from the other side of the stage and from New York City. Writing, directing, and producing, Stephanie, as well as, a few novels about the fashion and entertainment industry. Her latest

book will be coming out in the Spring.

ART WILKS (Mr. Oshira)—Art grew up in the hills of Pennsylvania and has degrees from Penn State, S.U.C. at Oswego, and the University of Rochester. He has worked in an open hearth for U.S. Steel, as a delivery boy on Shelter Island, and as a construction laborer in Watertown, N.Y. He likes dogs, pick-up trucks, and country music along with cool jazz and 50's rock and roll. His favorite artist is El Greco. He has had more than 25 parts at the NFCT. He has a very understanding wife, three great kids, and considers some of the nicest people around as his friends. If nothing else, he knows he is a lucky man.

LAUREN WOMACK (Child)-Lauren is a 6th grader at Mattituck Elemen-

tary School. This is her debut on the NFCT stage.

BOB ACKROYD (Director)—Bob most recently directed 6 RMS RIV VU, and prior to that, A Man for All Seasons, Prelude and The Lion in Winter.
