

BIOGRAPHIES

Annemarie Anderson (Mrs. Gilbert) — This is Anne's second time on the N.F.C.T. stage. Her debut was as Mrs. Harcourt in last summer's Anything Goes. But she's worked backstage for a number of years. Next year Anne will receive her B.S. in Biology with a minor in Physics from Livingston University in Livingston, Alabama.

Sondra Angelo (Chorus) — This is Sondra's first show at the N.F.C.T. and she hopes to be in many more to come. She enjoys modern dancing and

singing.

Annette Bednosky (Usherette, Chorus) — Henry marks Annette's fourth summer show and second time on stage with the Youth Players. Previously, she has been seen here in Anything Goes, Teahouse of the August Moon, and, Forum. Her other shows include Guys and Dolls, On Broadway, and Our Town at Southold High School — where she will be a senior. Besides a job at the North Fork Animal Hospital in Southold and selling Avon, Annette spends her time singing, painting, and dreaming about forever being a part of this madness called theater.

Cheryl Case (Vocal Director) — Cheryl has appeared in many, many, many (get the idea?) shows at the N.F.C.T. and also has been involved off stage as well. This is her first time as vocal director, although she was the vocal coach for a premiere opera while attending Brockport State. Cheryl is now a graduate student in Special Education at Hofstra University.

Carolann DiPirro (Chorus) — This is Carolann's first year with the N.F.C.T. Her favorite pastimes are acting, singing, dancing, and playing several musical instruments. She also likes elephant wrapping and moth-eating in the jungles of South America. So take your magnifying glass out and be sure to keep an eye open for Carolann. You'll be sure to see her.

Melissa A. Egan (Kafritz) — This is Melissa's third year with the N.F.C.T. She recently appeared in three plays at SUNY at Cortland. Melissa journeyed back to the Island and jumped (literally) into the role of Kafritz. Missy loves to scrub floors and clean out numerous litter boxes. Laundry is her morning glory of activities, especially when she uses her bare hands. Missy would like to dedicate her performance to her grandmother — "This one's for you, Grandma!" Donna Heinz (Chorus) — This is Donna's third summer with the N.F.C.T.'s youth players. She is very involved with theater during the school year at — you guessed it — Mattituck, where she will be a junior in the fall. In her spare time Donna enjoys dancing and cheerleading.

Carol Marchesi (Val) — This is Carol's second year with the fan filled audience theater group. After her brilliant performance as Bonnie in last year's Anything Goes, she has returned to the N.F.C.T. to wow the audience again as Val. This year Carol will be completing her junior year at C. W. Post after transferring from Brockport State. Carol is studying journalism and voice. She would like to thank her family for their support and says she'll be home for dinner in September. Here's an "A".

Chris McNulty (Capt. Ken) — The world's greatest impersonator, Chris has been in the N.F.C.T. for the past four years under the delusion that he was a queen's page, a French student, a trombone player, and a drill captain. He's also noted for his life guard act on the Mattituck beaches. After four years at Holy Family High School and 18 shows, he'll be attending Fairfield University next fall for more masochism. Need I say more?

Elizabeth McNulty (Chorus) — This is Liz's first appearance on the N.F.C.T. stage though last year she was seen a member of the stage crew. She is currently a sophomore at Holy Family High School where she has appeared in My Fair Lady and The Wizard of Oz.

Cathy is a recent graduate of Westhampton Beach High where she appeared in several shows while also studying at the American Academy of Dramatic Arts in Manhattan. Besides collecting exotic balloons, Cathy has competed in the New York State Junior Miss Pageant and the New York State Talented Miss Pageant where she placed as first runner-up. Michelle Smiley (Chorus) — A 15 year old sophomore at Mattituck High School, this is Michelle's second show at the N.F.C.T., and she hopes to be in more. Michelle is in her school chorus and was in All-County Chorus. She likes singing, acting, gymnastics, and school.

Lee Steidel (Chorus) — Lee is 14 and entering her freshman year at Mattituck High. This is her first appearance at the N.F.C.T. Her interests include playing the piano and most sports, especially field-hockey and softball.

Robert S. Taylor (Henry Orient and Lighting Designer) — After a three-year stint in the light booth, Robert returns to the stage. This is his twenty-fifth show, seventeen of which were with the N.F.C.T. Rob lives in Mattituck and is a Service Manager for Ultrasound Electronics Corp. in Greenport.

Bob Tirelli (Russ) — This is Bob's sixth summer at the N.F.C.T. Last year, he appeared as Billy Crocker in Anything Goes. Bob is funny. He wants you to laugh during his scenes because this is his last performance before entering the New England Conservatory of Music in Boston where he will be studying voice and bass guitar.
