BIOGRAPHIES

Michael Neumann (Cord Elam) — Michael is a sophomore at Boston College where he studies the practicality of Communism. This is his sixth summer with the NFCT, does a little of this and a little of that at

He will be a junior at Mattituck High and appeared in the last two Variety Shows and in Bye Bye Birdie. He looks forward to producing the 50th Annual Variety Show this fall.

Michelle Smiley (Ashley) — Michelle is a 16 year old junior at Mattituck High School. This is her third summer performance at NFCT. She plans on being in more plays and in addition to acting she loves singing,

dancing and gymnastics.

Lee Steidel (Ellen) — This is Lee's third show with the NFCT. She was in last summer's Henry . . . Sweet Henry, and in the Pit band of Company. She is 15 and entering her sophomore year at Mattituck High School. Her goal in life is to own the Boston Red Soxs.

BIOGRAPHIES

At the end of the summer Jocelyn will return to Simon's Rock, a liberal arts college located on the outskirts of Barrington, MA.

Annette K. Bednosky (Gertie Cummings) — A recent graduate from Southold High School, 17 year old Annette has been seen in five shows of our shows — most recently Company. She was the recipient of the 1st Annual NFCT Performing Arts Award and has attended the American Academy of Dramatic Arts in Manhattan. In the fall she will enter SUNY at Fredonia to study Musical Theatre. In the meantime she had a real job as a beach attendant this summer. Eee-hee!!!

David Carlson (Ali Hakim) — David moonlights as a waiter by day and tries to "shine" on the NFCT stage by night. He is a 19 year old resident of Hampton Bays who is about to enter in his junior year at Colgate University. Hello Grandpa.

Jack Conforti (Curly) — Jack has been a member of the NFCT for approximately seven years and has appeared in numerous productions here. He is presently attending Oneonta State University studying Education, Speech Communication, and Voice. While not attending school or going to rehearsal Jack works with Special Education children in the Riverhead Central School District. Because he finds the challenge of his long waited "leading role" of Curly enjoyable, working on Oklahoma! has been a great experience for Jack and will certainly be one of this favorite productions here.

Carolann DiPirro (Pigtails) — This is Carolann's second year with the NFCT — last year she appeared in Henry . . . Sweet Henry. This fall she will be a sophmore at Westhampton Beach High School. In her spare time she enjoys gymnastics, dancing, playing musical instruments and eating mint-chocolate chip ice cream.

BIOGRAPHIES

David Feige (Jud) — David, the product of an early 17th century genetic experiment, was born and raised in Madison WI. It was there, that he acquired his taste for Long Island, a taste which would help him greatly in his life-long love acting. David's first exposure to mass media came when he agreed to co-produce Sag Harbor Savings Bank commercials. From that prodigious start it was only a matter of time until his talent came to the attention of the NFCT.

Holli Haerr (Virginia) — At age 16, this is Holli's first appearance at the NFCT. She is a junior at Port Jefferson High School where she participates in the choir and chorale, and has been in All—County for five years. Her hobbies include singing, dancing, and playing the bassoon.

Debbie Kruel (Jeanne and Desire, Can Can Girl) — Debbie is a junior at the State University College at Oneonta, majoring in theatre. She is 21 years old and lives in Calverton. Although she has appeared in high school and college shows, she is performing on the NFCT stage for the first time.

Chris McNulty (Andrew Carnes) — Chris, the original member of the McNulty clan at the NFCT (fifth year) sometimes regrets starting the whole thing off. Happy to have his own song in this show, he promises to try not to trip at all this time. He holds the ultimate real job, lifeguarding. Chris is a pre-med student at Fairfield University, but he summers in Laurel and winters in Huntington. And if you were wondering . . . OLDER BROTHER!

Elizabeth McNulty (Aunt Eller) — Liz is 16 and will be entering her junior year at St. Anthony's High School in Huntington. This is her third summer at the NFCT. She can be found at her "real" job checking parking stickers at the Town Beach in Southold. SISTER!

Joanne McNulty (*Erin*) — Joanne is 15 years old and lives in Laurel. She will be a sophomore at Mattituck High School where she is in chorus. This is Jo's second summer at NFCT. COUSIN!

Tom McNulty (Fred Tucker) — Being one of the clan, Tom is a 17 year old senior at St. Anthony's High School in Huntington where he has been active in the theater company. This is Tom's fourth summer at the NFCT. During the day he lifeguards, another one of the "real" jobs, and has only lost three victims. BROTHER!

Meg Neumann (Alicia) — Oklahoma! is Meg's second show. She is 16 years old and attends Ramsey High School in New Jersey in the winter. This year Meg got her permit (watch out for the tan Driver's Ed car at 7:15 a.m.) and hopes to get her license soon.

BIOGRAPHIES

Richard Sullivan (Music Director) — Dick is a newcomer to the NFCT having recently returned to live in his native New Suffolk after 13 years in N.Y.C. Although a newcomer to our theatre, he has produced and directed a number of shows including Oliver, Oklahoma!, Annie Get Your Gun, and The Music Man. He has also written, produced and directed three full length musical reviews. In addition to musical theater he has directed dramas and several Greek tragedies, has been a church organist and choir director, and has given many piano recitals throughout N. Y. State. While serving in the U. S. Army, he toured many European cities as piano soloist with the 7th Army Symphony. He is the Chairman of the English Department in the South County School District Middle School.

Elizabeth M. Sieczka (Stage Manager) — Although she has been involved with many aspsects of this theater for 3 years, including cleaning, ushering, serving refreshments, performing and working on stage, prop, costume, and lighting crews, stage managing is new to Liz. In addition to the two shows she has been in at the NFCT, Liz has appeared in 2 Variety Shows and Bye, Bye Birdie at Mattituck High where she will be a senior. She feels that her enthusiasm must be contagious because this is getting to be a family affair!

Gordon Rogers (Costume Coordinator, Assistant Choreo-grapher) — Gordon has been involved in the NFCT for nine years and has acted, stage managed, done make-up, costumes and designed sets. Gordon is a resident of New York City but spends the summer in Cutchogue. During the winter Gordon has been studying to become a professional costume designer for the theatre, but hasn't the slightest idea of what he'll be doing in the upcoming fall.

Anthony Matson (Vocal Coach and Assistant to Mr. Sullivan) — Tony is making his second appearance with NFCT having appeared in the first show of the season: Barefoot in the Park. He has had numerous acting assignments over the years in much plays as Joan of Lorraine, Henry IV Part I, As You Like it, Kiss Me Kate. Desperate Hours, Arsenic and Old Lace, and Julius Caesar.
