

Biographies

- John Oliver Ashton (Dracula) John is an estate and financial planner with John O. Ashton, Inc. in Mattituck. Married and the father of four: Jane, Peggy, Tom and Mary. This is about his 20th appearance at NFCT. Prior credits include A Man for All Seasons, DA, and Teahouse of the August Moon.
- Todd Bibey (Butterworth) This is Todd's second appearance at NFCT. His first was in last years's comedy Never Too Late. He is a graduate of Greenport High School. His other credits include Oklahoma and The Rocky Horror Picture Show.
- Toni Chiaramonte (Lucy) Toni lives in Riverhead with her son Devin and their dogs Nugget and Bowie. She joined the NFCT less than two years ago, and has done lights, been the stage manager and acted. Her first effort on stage was as Ruth in Blithe Spirit, and she appeared as Lady Anne in Celebration of Shakespeare. This time around, Toni feels she has a role she can really sink her teeth into.
- Albert J. Cavagnaro (Abraham Van Helsing) Al comes to the NFCT from the South Fork. A lifetime resident of East Hampton he was, for a number of years, president of the Guild Hall Players. Shows he has directed include Solid Gold Cadillac and Teahouse of the August Moon. He also performed in many productions including Claudia, Arsenic and Old Lace and Stalag 17. This past summer he was an extra in the Alan Alda film Sweet Liberty.
- Michael Conforti (Assistant Director) Michael has played many roles on the NFCT stage and has enjoyed all of them tremendously, so he thought it was time to play a new role (for the first time) as Assistant Director to prepare for his role as Director sometime in the future. He is very excited about it.
- Pat Heaney (Producer) Never on-stage but often backstage, Pat enjoys all aspects of the theatre. Employed at Southold Savings Bank, she resides in Aquebogue with her cat, Hugo.

- Putnam Lee (Dr. Seward) Putnam was last seen on the NFCT stage as Mr. Drumm in DA and has subsequently directed last year's production of Night Watch. He has also been seen in the C.T.C. productions in East Hampton as Granpa in On Borrowed Time, as Thor in Mornings at Seven, and as General MacKenzie in Ten Little Indians. Previously he had more than ten years' experience with the Amateur Comedy Club in New York.
- David Markel (R. M. Renfield) Since January David has played Richard in Lion in Winter, directed You Can't Take it with You, both for the Shelter Island Players and was part of the ensemble in Walt Whitman Song of Ourselves for North East Stage. He is an auctioneer/appraiser.
- Lynn Martin-Sharar (Maid) This is Lynn's second time on the NFCT stage, her first was in Frankenstein, several years ago where she also played a maid. After only having a week's rehearsal this time she hopes she can meet everyone's demands in the household. Lynn has been an active member and has worked on numerous shows and just completed her term as a Board of Directors member. She has produced several musicals at NFCT which include Henry, Sweet Henry, Company and Gypsy.
- Maureen Moffat (Director) Maureen's roots in the NFCT go back to its infancy. She has done just about every job from acting to scrubbing. Favorite roles were Elvira in Blithe Spirit (the first one) Regina in The Peanut Butter Prince (the third one) and the mother in DA. Maureen lives in Southold with Disk Jockey Daria, Parks & Recreation graduate Tim, "House Nut" Gordon, sometimes there student Tina and (ahchoo) Misha ther cat.
- Bill Sousa (Jonathan Harker) On the NFCT stage, Bill has appeared in Little Mary Sunshine, Once Upon a Mattress, Anything Goes, Come Blow Your Horn, The Peanut Butter Prince, Frankenstein, Butterflies Are Free and Deathtrap. He produced Godspell, Forum, and Barefoot In The Park, and directed Applause, Company, and Gypsy. He once again will direct the annual adult musical this spring, The Sound of Music.
