HARVEY BAGSHAW (Francis) — This is Harvey's 3rd summer show and 4th overall production. He has been involved in Babes in Arms, Music Man, and Our Town with the N.F.C.T. Harvey will be attending the University of North Carolina at Charlotte, where he will be studying Architecture and/or Business. And, of course, "Theatre" on the side.

JOHN BROOKS (Blake Barton) — John is 19 and has lived in Mattituck all his life. John was in Babes in Arms two summers ago, but couldn't do The Music Man last summer because of an annoying little thing (college). John will be a sophomore at Cornell University this fall, if he doesn't decide to hop a plane to Uruguay and teach the natives to cha-cha.

SEAN BRYAN (Chorus) — This is Sean's third attempt at writing a biography about himself. Unfortunately, each previous attempt ended in disaster. First the job, then the dead chameleon! ... So, to prevent any harm to family, friends, and surviving chameleons, Sean refuses to write another!

KATHY FOX (Chorus) — Kathy is a newcomer to the NFCT stage but has been seen in various productions at MHS, such as variety shows, *Pippin*, and *Hello Dolly*. Next fall Kathy will be a freshman at Boston University, pursuing a career in veterinary science. Kathy can be seen with many other cast members at any of the Town Beaches. Kathy lives in Laurel and you'll be sure to notice her bright smile on stage, as she used to work for a dentist.

DAWNE FULCHER (Chorus) — Dawne is a 1985 graduate of Riverhead High School, and is currently attending SUNY Farmingdale where she is pursuing a career in Medical Laboratory Technology. At Farmingdale she is a member of the "Backstage Theatre Group" and was in the May 1986 production of Best Little Whorehouse in Texas. This is her first production with NFCT, and she hopes to continue and grow within it.

GEORGE GRATTAN (Chorus) — George was almost unable to take part in Bells Are Ringing due to his being hired on as Oliver North's new secretary. Next fall, in between smuggling records out of the Pentagon in his underwear, he will be attending Holy Cross College. Just in case George needs to testify before a Senate sub-committee, he will draw upon his vast acting experience here at NFCT, where he has been in the past four summer productions.

HOLLI HAERR (Ludwina Smiley) — This is Holli's fourth summer at NFCT, and she's just all aquiver at being back. Holli summers in Southold and winters in Indiana U. In Holli's spare time she enjoys playing football in graveyards, goofing off, and messing about with high explosives.

You may recognize Sean as a veteran of Saturday Night Live — he portrays Satan in the Church Lady skits. Sean rounds out his intellectual personality by donating chicken pot pies to the poor. Model/actress Poriz Rova sums up Sean's personality: "Sean is one hell of a guy."

DENA JAQUILLARD (Chorus) — Dena lives in Mattituck. She enjoys being with all of the interesting people at the theater. She has appeared in MHS variety shows, and has played such roles as a nun in *The Sound of Music* and a dead person in *Our Town*. When she's not dead, she enjoys swimming and dancing.

CARYN KUJAWSKI (Chorus) — This is Caryn's first year at NFCT, and she's enjoying every minute of it. Her roles have included tops and worms (in elementary school), and she recently participated in the MHS production of *Hello Dolly*. She keeps busy in the summer as a teacher's aide at the high school and a beach gate attendant in Mattituck.

WADE "OIL-CAN" KARLIN (Sandor) — This is Wade's second summer show, and he really loves playing the part of a con-man. This ex-boxer-turned-fisherman lives in Mattituck with his dog, Jake. In his spare time he likes to watch Jaws, act like James Dean, and wander the hills looking for his parents, who abandoned him to live with the wolves. By the way, if you're out there, clap loudly, okay?

DEBORAH A. KRUEL (Sue Summers) — Debbie is just "ringing" about doing another show on the NFCT stage. This is her fourth. She has a theatre B. A. from the State University at Oneonta. She had a "brilliant" and "grand" time interning at the Abbey Theatre in Dublin in her final semester. She can soon be seen on Channel 25 with fellow comedians — rubberhead!!

RON McEVOY (Dr. Kitchell) — Ron is a proud representative of Riverhead High School. He has done such plays as *Grease*, *Pirates of Penzance*, and watch for *West Side Story* in '88! Ron's favourite three wishes would be 1) to meet Prince, 2) to own a Maserati, and 3) to win Lotto.

CHRISTOPHER McNULTY (Larry Hastings) — He could not be reached for comment. Unnamed sources quoted him as saying, "Where is that wonder girl?", "Come on back to the party!", and "Goodnight everybody!" He is presently looking for an overpaid, underworked job. Have fun tonight, but remember, it's only fun until someone gets hurt.

ELIZABETH McNULTY (Mme. Grimaldi) — Liz is a true veteran of the NFCT stage, this being her fifth appearance in a summer production. JOANNE McNULTY (Chorus) — Bells marks Jo's fifth summer and sixth show with NFCT. She has most recently appeared in Hello Dolly at MHS. Joanne has just been cast as the nervous freshman at Villanova University in Pennsylvania next fall, giving up her current role as Southold Town Beach Attendant. Jo lives in Laurel with her two parents, two siblings, two dogs and a cat named Cat.

MARK W. McNULTY (Chorus) — Mark is a sixteen-year-old from a small planet he likes to call "Earth". Although on the run from the law, he does plan to attend St. Anthony's H.S. in the fall. By the way, if you find any gum under your seat, it's his — please return it. His interests include waterskiing, firewalking, cannabalism and breaking & entering. Mark was most recently seen in The Music Man and The Fantastiks. Remember, help control the pet population: have your pet spayed or neutered.

MEG McNULTY (Boopsy) — Meg is the youngest and most unique member of the McNulty family. She collects stolen merchandise. Since her last subpoena to family court, Meg has appeared in *The Music Man* at Amaryllis. She is entering her sophomore year at St. Anthony's H.S. and plans to straighten out her act before she graduates. Good luck, Meg!

TOM McNULTY (Carl) — Most recently seen as the kid in Shepard's *The Unseen Hand*, this slap-happy guy is a 20-year-old acting major at Catholic U. Aroused by the British invasion of theatre, Tom will be spearheading the vanguard of American students invading London this fall to study drama through Roger Williams College. Olivier, eat your heart out.

MARY MOTTO (Chorus) — Mary lives in Laurel and attends Mattituck High School. This is her sixth overall production and her fourth with NFCT. Her last musical was Mame at NFCT. When she isn't practicing, Mary is either working or racing sailboats at Mattituck Yacht Club. During school Mary is involved in numerous sports and activities such as tennis, basketball (yes, all five feet of her), and working as an editor on the school newspaper. Mary's most notable activity is bikeriding from one activity to another. It would seem that Mary's bike has logged more miles than most cars.

EAMON O'GRADY (Chorus) — Eamon has little to say about himself. He's 14, quotes his past experience in drama as "enough", has brown hair, and insists on Crest toothpaste.

KATY O'GRADY (Chorus) — Though she thrives on living in the past, as seen through song and dance in Bells Are Ringing, theatre remains in the future for Katy, a theatre minor and likely history major at The College of Wooster. Katy has three NFCT shows already under her belt — she portrayed Betty in Babes in Arms and Eulalie Mackeckmie Shinn in The Music Man, as well as a postulant in The Sound of Music. She performed in the American premiere of Sam Dowling's Riverman at Wooster, playing a waitress, news reporter, widow, and various persons seen on the streets of 1911 London. Adding to Katy's appreciation for illusion and her ability to create something from nothing was the spring semester spent working as props person for Wooster's production of Translations. Next summer Katy plans to be in Japan, learning the language very quickly and riding a Suzuki.
