

He has been very busy behind the scenes, having served as secretary on our Board and co-directing last year's smash hit comedy "Don't Drink the Water". Although he has enjoyed his work behind the scenes, his is glad to be back onstage, where he feels more at home.

PHYLLIS CONLEY (Margaret Lord) After a fifteen year hiatus from the theatre, Phyllis, a new member of the N.F.C.T., decided to try it one more time. Her desire to perform first became evident at the age of four, reciting "My Shadow" for a church group. At the age of twelve she played Pyramus in "Midsummer Nights Dream" and sang in the chorus for "H.M.S. Pinafore" and "The Mikado".
