BIOGRAPHIES

Goeff Conway (Reed) – Geoff is a recent arrival from England. Acting is something he always wanted to try. He has not been on stage since his school days in England and decided now was the right time!

Paul Crowther (Hoffman) – This is Paul's second appearance at NFCT. He was last seen as the Ambassador in Don't Drink the Water. He works for the Department of the Treasury. His good Dad & Mom can't figure out where they went wrong having a son who works for the I.R.S.

Harry Denys (S.S. Guard) – Residence: Riverhead, NY; Occupation: Reading Teacher RCSD; Vocation: Husband to one, father of 3; Avocation: Actor; Experience: 20 years Riverhead Middle/Jr. High School, 10 years Riverhead Faculty and Community Theater (Actor, singer, sound technician, raconteur, jester-at-large); Career goal: leave 'em laughing!

Steve Gocha (Geneva Man) – Steve is a native of Riverhead and works in the Greenport Post Office. He shares a house with two of his four sisters – he also has two brothers. In his spare time, he is a member of the Riverhead Fire Department, bowls one night a week, and is a dedicated player of Dungeons and Dragons. It was this role playing game which led him to try his hand at theater for the first time.

Michael Horn (Stosh) - Michael is a native Long Islander. He graduated from Pierson High School and attended the American Academy of Dramatic Arts in Manhattan. He relocated to Riverhead with his wife Diana and three children and works as a manager with AT&T Communications. He has appeared as a stand-up comic at the Comic Strip, Manhattan Apple and Vincent's Place. He has also co-directed two musicals at Sag Harbor High School. This is Michael's first appearance at NFCT and he is looking forward to many more.

Wade Karlin (*Price*) – Wade has been with the NFCT for three years and is very excited about acting in *Stalag 17*. He has been in several productions and says, "Hey, I always have a pretty cool time here!" He lives in Mattituck with his canine buddy, Jake d. Dog!

James Macaluso (Duke) – Jim is making his acting debut with the NFCT. He blames his acting career on friends at a local watering hole who convinced him to take the plunge. Jim lives with his wife in Hampton Bays.

Dan McCarthy (Harry Shapiro) – Dan has appeared in various productions while majoring in speech and theater arts at Iona College. His roles included Cates in Inherit the Wind, Pilate in Jesus Christ, Superstar, Tobias in A Delicate Balance, Frank Strang in Equus, as well as numerous character portrayals. After graduation, he attended the American Academy of Dramatic Arts. Dan has recently moved to Southold and he is making his debut with NFCT.

Bill Sousa (Horney) – During Bill's 10-year membership with the NFCT he has appeared on our stage in Little Mary Sunshine, Come Blow Your Horn, Anything Goes, Butterflies Are Free, Once Upon A Mattress, Deathtrap, Frankenstein, and Don't Drink the Water. Bill also appeared in the Hampton Theatre Company's production of Dracula as Dracula last spring and has directed high school productions on the East End. He has also directed Applause, Company, Gypsy, Sound of Music, Plaza Suite, and Mame for NFCT as well as having produced Godspell, Forum, Barefoot in the Park and Grease. Bill is serving a two-year term on our board of directors and he looks forward to producing our next musical, Promises, Promises. He also hopes to direct next season after a two-year absence from directing.

Paul S. Sisson (Corporal Shultz) – After 17 years as a "stage father," Paul decided to see the house from the other side of the foot lights. Married with three children and four grand-children, Paul lives in Riverhead & teaches mathematics at Mercy High School. With 30 years of teaching experience, being a prison camp guard seems like type casting!

George Tibbetts (Marko) – George was previously seen as Roy Hubley in the NFCT production of Plaza Suite. He lives in Water Mill and co-owns Succotash Antiques in Westhampton Beach.

Larry Tuthill (*Herb Gordon*) – Larry is a resident of Greenport and is making his theatrical debut in *Stalag 17*. When he is not on stage, he is an attorney practicing law in Cutchogue.

Glen von Wergers (S.S. Captain) – Glen is a native of Cincinnati, Ohio, and moved to the East End in 1987. He is married to a lawyer and they reside in East Quogue. Glen was once a riverboat captain on the Mississippi – the last boat he steered was the Mark Twain on the Ohio River. He also makes custom jewelry, writes short gothic horror stories and has a painting and window washing business. In his spare time, he is a private investigator in New York City.

Alan Walter (Sefton) – Alan teaches music for the Shoreham-Wading River School District and lives in Riverhead with his wife, two children, two cats and a silly dog. He directs the choir for the Old Steeple Community Church in Aquebogue and plays violin and guitar with the Hampton Folk & Chamber Trio. While this is Alan's first NFCT production he has been in many of the Riverhead Faculty & Community Theatre productions. In addition to assorted singing and dancing spots his roles included Cornelius Hackle in Hello Dolly and Junior Babcock in Mame. He was assistant director for their production of My Fair Lady and acted as producer and musical director for Westhampton Beach High School's production of Oliver.
