

Marianne Carey (Violet) – Marianne is a resident of Shelter Island and Manhattan. She has studied acting with the New York Theater and The Lee Strasberg Theater Institute. This is Marianne's first performance with the NFCT.

Bill Corey (Stuff) - This is Bill's first appearance with the NFCT. He has previously worked with The Heights Players as well as some college productions.

Bob Erland (Fly & Charles) - Bob has appeared as Carter in Witness for the Prosecution, Owen Turner in Light Up the Sky and the Rev. Paris in The Crucible. He is currently serving on the NFCT Board of Directors.

Debbie Gurriere (Miss Lucy) - This is Debbie's third consecutive season with the NFCT having been in the casts of A Streetcar Named Desire and Sweet Charity. She is especially happy to again work with her "Street Car Family:" Todd, Pam, Dave and Judy. And yes, her southern accent is authentic; so to Ray, Will and Rad, she say "Love y'all."

Dennis Hayes (Heckler) - Dennis is a resident of Manhattan and spends weekends on Shelter Island. This is his first production with the NFCT and he is very enthusiastic about being here. Dennis is a student at the Ernie Martin Studio Theatre in New York City. In NYC, during the past year, he has played the roles of Macbeth in MacBeth and Trigorin in Seagull; and played the lead role of Eddie Hejazi in an original play called The Lady Swims Today.
