AUTHOR'S NOTES

In 1934 President Flugencio Batista gave the United States a large portion of land surrounding Guantanamo Bay in Cuba. The land was given in perpetuity and was to be used as a naval base.

In 1959 Fidel Castro came to power. He asked for the land back and placed Cuban troops just outside the windward perimeter of the American base. The U.S. erected a fence and created Rifle Security Company Windward, a group of specially trained marine sentries, who have been standing guard twenty-four hours a day ever since.

The play is a work of fiction inspired by an occurrence which served as a point of departure for the author.

Aaron Sorkin is a 1983 graduate of Syracuse University with a BFA in theatre. His one-act play Hidden in This Picture premiered in 1988 at the West Bank Cafe Downstairs Theatre Bar and was expanded into Making Movies, a comedy produced Off-Broadway at the Promenade Theatre.
