

He acted and directed professionally in New York and has appeared in commercials and industrial films. He directed and acted in 5 productions for the NFCT and has appeared with the East Hampton and Quogue Theatre groups.

RUSS THOMES (*Beverly Carlton*)–Russ has been playing "odd ball" parts at The Amateur Comedy Club of New York and with the Snarks for a dozen years.
