

BIOGRAPHIES

Watching the actors struggle to create believable characters, learn lines and blocking, help with sets and form a strong ensemble is a remarkable process. Each person, experienced or not, collaborated daily for six weeks to realize our production. This is still exciting to Phoebe after nearly 20 years, and she hopes to begin teaching regular classes in acting and public speaking, should space be available and the interest remain high. Finally, Phoebe wishes to thank two dear friends, Gordon and Betty, to whom this production is dedicated. They were surely loved and are sorely missed.
