PRODUCTION STAFF

Phoebe Rey (Director)—As the director, I'm responsible for establishing an ensemble working with the actors, to create their characters, interpreting the writer's point of view, collaborating with the producer to bring the show in within budget and making sure all technical areas are well staffed. I call it "organized chaos" as we struggle through rehearsals, build and decorate sets, create programs and posters, design lighting areas, costumes, makeup and properties management.

Upon final presentation you see the results of all this work as the actors bring our play to life. What you don't see is the technical staff of stage managers, ticket sales and reservation personnel, house managers, refreshment providers, assistant directors, hardworking producers and the set designers and builders.

Costumes are researched and made, makeup created, props selected for time appropriateness, and stage managers co-ordinate actors and props. All this is done without pay or even applause. These technical support people are fantastic, reliable, and often over looked. As a director, I salute them all, and sincerely thank them for helping my actors and me in bringing Neil Simon's vision to you.

So next time you see a play, certainly applaud all the hard-working actors, directors and producers, but also take a moment to appreciate the technical staff, without whom this collaborative art could not be brought to you-live!

Christopher M. Mead (Assistant Director)—Well, they finally found a way to get me off stage. Having worked behind the scenes last year in Lost in Yonkers, I'm back as Assistant Director in this year's production. I've also been onstage at the NFCT in Where's Charley, Prime of Miss Jean Brodie, and most recently in RFCT's Anything Goes. From casting to reading to rehearsals to curtain, what a long strange trip it's been. My thanks to cast and crew, wife and son for all their support. Enjoy!
