The North Fork Community Theater is proud to present You're a Good Man, Charlie Brown. Amidst the distractions of the world, it is a relief to return to a simpler time with your favorite Peanuts gang. Come along with Charlie Brown and his pals as we discover what kind of man he is capable of becoming.

In the mid-60's, Clark Gesner, once a Sesame Street writer, wrote an album featuring characters made popular by the Peanuts comic strip created by Charles M. Shultz. After producers approached Gesner to turn the album into a stage show, it had its premiere at Theater 80 in New York City on March 7, 1967.

The revival we present this evening has some significant changes from the original show. Gesner deleted seventeen scenes and added twenty-one; more significant was the replacement of the character Patty with Charlie Brown's little sister, Sally. The New York production opened February 5, 1999 and was nominated for four Tony Awards, winning two.


We invite you to sit back and turn the worry of the world off for a while, as you enjoy a day in the life of Charlie Brown.



This is Jarret's third show here at the NFCT. He has been a parade of baseball players in Damn Yankees and a senile old Scottish father in Brigadoon. He thanks the director, Tracy for casting him as Linus, Ellis for putting up with his bad singing, his parents and family, his friends, Sharon, Carmine, and Chris for their support. Ellis has also performed and tuned pianos at Westbury Music Fair. Currently, he is working at the East End School of the Arts as a Voice and Piano instructor and is also the director of their Youth Choir.
