

The Fantasticks began its long life as one of three one-act plays performed at Barnard College (the other two one-acts have since fallen info oblivion.) Authors Jones and Schmidt so loved the show they'd created, based on Edmund Rostand's Les Romanesques, that they expanded the show and began searching for a theater. They finally came across Greenwich Village's Sullivan Street Theater—dusty and dirty, a real eyesore actually—but the price was right! Little did they realize that the show would occupy the theater for 42 years!

The show is the longest-running American production ever. Among the famous performers who have appeared in productions are Jerry Orbach (the original El Gallo), F. Murray Abraham, Glenn Close, John Davidson, Eliiott Gould, Robert Goulet, and Liza Minnelli.

The Fantasticks finally closed in 2002, only to re-open off-Broadway at the Snapple theater in 2006, where its long life continues. We hope you enjoy this version, the first musical of our fiftieth season.

Here's to another fifty years, and more!
