DIRECTOR'S NOTE

I have always been fascinated by the plays of A. R. Gurney. He is a prolific writer, with more than forty published scripts, of which I have seen at least a dozen produced. (The NFCT has presented two very recently: *The Dining Room* in 2005, and *Love Letters* just last month.)

Almost all of Gurney's work deals with the "old-fashioned, connected, communal WASP-y" culture, once dominant in America but now fading. In each play, however, Gurney tackles this subject from a totally different perspective, the discovery of which provides an intriguing challenge for actor, director and audience. So it is with *Labor Day*, ostensibly an old-fashioned, bitter-sweet, family comedy, but with a structure that is somewhat Pirandellian.

Gurney frequently weaves references to his own background and family into his plays. I believe this is nowhere more true than in *Labor Day*, in which there can be little doubt that the father, John, is a thinly veiled A. R. Gurney. We are privileged to have Forrest Compton in the role of John. Forrest, who has played Gurney characters in several professional productions, has had the pleasure of becoming personally acquainted with the playwright, and confirms that in this case he may indeed be portraying the author of the work you are about to watch, and hopefully enjoy!

Forrest Compton (John)—Forrest made his New York stage debut playing Cassio to Earle Hyman's Othello Off-Broadway. He appeared in Manhattan Theatre Club's production of End Of Summer; the Los Angeles productions of The Iceman Cometh, Look Homeward Angel and Spoon River Anthology. Regionally, he has played at both the Missouri and Nebraska Reps, PA Stage, Philadelphia Drama Guild and Westport Country Playhouse. His most recent stage role was Dr. Sloper in The Heiress at the Two River Theatre. On TV, he had a 14 year run as Mike Karr on The Edge of Night. Prior to that he played Colonel Gray on Gomer Pyle, and appeared on The Twilight Zone, Hogan's Heroes, The FBI, and The Fugitive. His most recent TV appearance was on Ed. Film credits include The Outsider, McBain, Inherit The Wind, and Kings Go Forth. A graduate of Swarthmore College and Yale Drama School, Forrest is delighted to be playing his third Gurney father, having previously appeared in multiple productions of The Cocktail Hour and The Middle Ages.



Georgia Hester (Ellen)-Georgia began acting at age ten with Miss Flovia Drazy's Student Players in Chicago doing plays, radio shows and industrial films. She majored in drama in college and went to the American Theatre Wing in New York to pursue an acting career, later studying with Sydney Pollack and Charles Conrad of the Neighborhood Playhouse. In Charles' class she met and married her husband, actor Guy Griffis. Georgia has performed in stock and regional theatres around the country, including Buffalo's Studio Arena, The LaJolla Playhouse, The Whole Theatre Company and PAF on Long Island. She and her husband founded the Courtyard Theatre in Buffalo with help from the New York State Council of the Arts. She was drama director for five years at the Morristown Beard School. She has also appeared in early television shows for Studio One, in several off off Broadway shows, and in commercials for telephones and soap. Recent years have been focused on seven delightful grand children. Georgia resides on Shelter Island and New York and is very pleased to be back on the boards at NFCT.

Rusty Kransky (*Dennis*)—Born in Tasmania and raised in California, Rusty has been active in community theater for 33 years. (Amazing, since he's only 35.) 



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Workshop: The Actor's Craft

NFCT will offer an eight-week workshop for adults on Saturday afternoons, starting March 14th through May 2nd, from 1:00 to 4:30 p.m.

The intensive introductory program, led by Michael Manuelian (who, among many other credits, recently directed "Proof" at NFCT), will focus on four basic areas of the actor's training: Scene Study, Technique, Singing Interpretation and Vocal Production/Body Work. NFCT will offer the workshop for a nominal fee, sufficient to cover only out-of-pocket expenses incurred in connection with the class (e.g., electricity, heat, accompanist, etc.). Michael has graciously agreed to volunteer his services. Currently, NFCT estimates the actual costs to translate to \$65 for each member of the workshop.

Michael's goal is to allow each member an opportunity to work each week. To that end, the workshop will be limited to 8–10 members who are willing to commit to attend all eight sessions. Please note that this workshop will require outside preparation.
