

When Andrew Lloyd Webber and Tim Rice first crafted "Joseph and the Amazing Technicolor Dreamcoat", it was for a school choir performance. Almost 50 years later, that original 15 minute piece, loosely based on the Book of Genesis's "coat of many colors" has morphed into one of the most recognized and performed musicals of our time.

It was with mixed emotions that I accepted the role of director for this production. I was hesitant to make my directorial debut with such a large scale musical which in addition to being ALL music, requires so many talented cast members! "Joseph" was not a show I had warm fuzzy feelings about, not a show that I felt any emotional connection to, however, these seemingly negative obstacles quickly became blessings. No pre-conceived notions or outside influences allowed me to envision this show with my own voice, and craft it with my own ideas. Many months of thought (as well as a constant flow of ideas back and forth with my MD Jen and producer Mary) led to a new and modern interpretation of "Joseph" while preserving the classic moments that have made this show beloved for so many years. This new interpretation in the first weeks of rehearsals seemed to be leading to a more serious, poignant "Joseph", however, one of my actors pulled me aside one night and made a very simple and yet crucial statement-one I needed to hear: "It's ok to be funny". This opened Pandora's box and we haven't looked back!

"Joseph" being a show that is completely sung-through with very few spoken lines also posed an exciting challenge. I attempted to instill in my actors that exploring their character and conveying this personality to the audience would be a key to this show's success. The Narrators especially embraced this challenge. We explored who these two women were as individuals, how they each related to the children, the story around them and to each other. This has elevated these two women from simple "storytellers" to complete characters that develop over the course of the show. The brothers were also a challenge to craft since they are a group of 11 (11??) individuals who are essentially make up one main character. One of my greatest joys in this show was working with this group of highly talented, exuberant, artistic individuals. My brothers: You made me fall in love with this show.

"Community theatre" can often be used as an unflattering term provoking images of amateurism. An amateur does something for pleasure rather than payment. We perform at the NFCT for the love of it. Therefore I believe that this production has been an example of community theatre at its best. Everyone is here for the love of performing. I could not have dreamed up a more talented, dedicated and affable cast. My biggest thrill in this show has been watching relationships develop between cast members, and bringing new and old faces together to create a fantastic piece of entertainment that I know you all will enjoy. This show would have been diminished with the absence of any single person involved. I feel incredibly lucky to have made my directorial debut with this production and this fantastic cast.

Enjoy the show dreamers.
