



Christiana Bitonti

Ms. Bitonti is the founder and director of Peconic Ballet Theatre and most recently Peconic Ballet Foundation. She has choreographed and directed ballets such as: "Cinderella," "Sleeping Beauty" "Snow White" "The Nutcracker" "Alice in Wonderland," "Wizard of Oz" "A Midsummer Nights Dream" "Beauty and the Beast" "The Little Mermaid" "Coppelia" and "Swan Lake." She debuted contemporary works in NYC and has won awards for her choreography, which include Best Choreography for her modern piece "Ying Yang Yo" at the Onstage American Dance Competition. Ms. Bitonti choreographed for numerous college, high school and elementary theater plays, some credits include: "Anything Goes" "Peter Pan" & "Cinderella." She has danced professionally with Ballet Long Island and holds a Master of Arts degree from New York University in counseling.

Jillian Adams

Ms. Adams grew up training with Claudia Marinescu and went on to study with the Manhattan Ballet School under scholarship. In 2009, under the direction of Denise Jefferson, she was admitted to the fellowship program at the Ailey School where she performed and debuted original pieces by Carlos Dos Santos and Juilliard's Peter London. Personal statement

I have been sculpting and painting for over 50 years and spent 32 years teaching and designing theatre sets, while still creating and exhibiting artwork.

Moving from California to the East Coast meant a withdrawal, from



the nearly year round warmth, colorful plants, and sunny days, to a cold, subdued long gray climate. In order to compensate, all sorts of indoor plants and flowers began to fill my interior spaces, which encouraged a long series of plant illustrations.

Saddened by the drastic

changes in my home state, and seeing the same losses of natural and pastoral beauty threatening the East End of Long Island, I have been driven to capture "what's left". Whether an open piece of land, an old barn, or a farm vehicle, the desire is to record through art, the history of a culture, all too soon buried and forgotten.



Though my work originated in the three dimensional, I have fluctuated between sculpting in stone, wood, or reliefs of various materials and the two dimensional world, finding that the process of moving dimensions between creates inspiration for personal growth and change.
