

Director's Note:

This show marks my debut as director of a book musical. My first encounter with the musical *Cabaret* came when I was a teenager and saw the original theatrical release of the 1972 film version with Liza Minnelli. While it is a brilliant film by itself, winning 8 Academy Awards, it is not a satisfying screen adaptation of the stage musical because it eliminates the show's major subplot and drops many wonderful songs.

When I was finishing up my Master's Degree in English seven years later, my final paper was on the evolution of Sally Bowles, the show's central character, who originally appeared in a novel, which was adapted into the stage play I Am a Camera before becoming the musical you're about to see. While I read both the original stage play and the musical for the paper, my focus was on Sally, so I paid little attention to the supporting characters and almost none to the music since this was, after all, an English class.

Not until I saw a 1988 Broadway revival of *Cabaret* featuring Joel Grey recreating his Emcee role from both the Broadway original and the film did I fully experience the show as written. I was bowled over, falling in love with the score and finding myself deeply moved by the subplot involving the middleaged couple, Fraulein Schneider and Herr Schultz.

For those of you who do not know the show, or only know it via the film adaptation, I hope you experience the same sense of discovery I did. This is a brilliant show; the 1998 revival version you're about to see, which incorporates additional songs from the film version, ran twice as long as the original Broadway production of 1966. And although it is set in Berlin during the rise of Nazism, its theme is as relevant today as it ever was. When faced with any kind of political threat, do we stand up for what is right or ignore it and party on? As Fraulein Schneider so pointedly asks in Act II, "What Would You Do?"
