

This production, conceived as a tribute to the late great Stephen Sondheim, is dedicated to Huck's late great mother, Sue Klein, who always encouraged him to make it beautiful.

Justin D. Harris (Assistant Director) is an actor, performer, theater educator, director, and writer. 



A Note from the Director ...

Welcome to *Sunday in the Park with George*, James Lapine and Stephen Sondheim's musical masterpiece about the art of making art (and the angst of being an artist). Their theatrical vision was inspired by the painting *A Sunday Afternoon on the Island of La Grande Jatte* by Georges Seurat, painted over the course of two years in 1880s Paris, currently hanging in the Art Institute of Chicago.

Of all the artworks I've seen in museums around the world, few have been so captivating, so impossible to walk away from. Its unconventional approach — using specks of color to create shapes and images (on such a grand scale, with so many characters) — casts a mesmerizing spell on its viewers. Perhaps that same spell is responsible for all the writing and workshops that ultimately became the show that opened on Broadway in 1984, then won the Pulitzer Prize, and decades later continues to reach audiences in productions worldwide.

What interested me in exploring this material was not only the dynamic ways it translates the identity and energy of the painting to the multidisciplinary landscape of musical theater, but also the curiosity it explores: what is happening in the imagination of an artist in the process of channeling ideas and possibilities into a form of expression? How does the mind become an incubator of vision for the creative gesture? When artists make things, what everyone sees is the result, the outcome, the thing. This show invites us into the churnings of the creative imagination as it strives to make the thing, that part of the creative process we never see because it's hidden in skulls, tucked away in inaccessible realms of intangibility. This show exploits the language of theater to explore the fantasy of bringing the inner workings of the creative mind into view, making that unreachable inner space its subject, dramatized for the playful pretense of accessibility. Even if this effort is just one version of the ultimately futile folly of making the unknowable known.

In the first act, the creative inner life of the painter Georges Seurat fills the stage as he works to achieve his vision. In the second act, a hundred years later, his great-grandson (also named George, also an artist) wrestles with the realities of the commercial art world, while feeling disconnected from his sense of passion and purpose, those ephemeral forces that fuel the work in the first place. But when he travels to visit the island where the painting was made, his reward is a magical reunion and the reboot of inspiration he needed.

Thank you for coming to see this thing OUR imaginations made. We hope you enjoy it.


