





TOM DEANGELO (Stage Manager) — Thomas DeAngelo - Stage Manager - This is Thomas' first production with NFCT. He has stage managed for many LI theaters. His credits include: On Golden Pond, Oklahoma!, Today I am a Fountain Pen, Pump Boys & Dinettes, Inherit the Wind, That Championship Season, Jake's Women, A Funny...Forum, Cabaret, 12 Angry Men, Psycho Beach Party, An Enemy of the People, Doubt, The Tempest, The Boys Next Door, Greater Tuna, Wrong Turn at Lungfish and I Ought to be in Pictures. He served as Production assistant for the 1992 Easter Show @ Radio City Music Hall.

JUSTIN D. HARRIS (Assistant Director) — Justin is an east end actor, director, writer et al and incredibly honored to work on this beautiful and extremely collaborative piece. He is a Brown University graduate (Neuroscience) and the Arts Academy Manager at Westhampton Beach Performing Arts Center. Justin is a masterful teaching artist working with youth and adults from Manhattan to Montauk and of course the beloved North Fork. Credits include administrative and performance work at Oregon Shakespeare Festival and the Consortium of Asian American Theaters & Artists ConFest and directing and choreographing the Long Island premiere of Steve Martin and Edie Brickell's folk/bluegrass musical Bright Star. Favorite performance roles include Emcee in Cabaret, Chutes&Ladders in Water By The Spoonful, and Frederick Douglass in the upcoming production of The Agitators with Boots On The Ground Theater.

HUCK HIRSCH (*Director*) — Huck Hirsch has directed plays and musicals at Soho Rep, The Lamb's Theatre and HERE Arts Center in New York City; Pirates Playhouse, Plaza Playhouse, and a Don Kirshner infomercial starring Davy Jones. He is a graduate of the famed High School of Performing Arts and Amherst College, where he majored in Theater and Dance; but this lifelong love started with an exuberant mother who filled his childhood with music, poems, dance, stories, theater and daily

doses of irrepressible comedy. He dedicates this to her, for all she did then to make all he does now possible...if not probable.

CHRISTIAN LEPORE (Assistant Director/Sound) — Christian is delighted to return to NFCT, once again collaborating with Huck Hirsch. He was last seen here (with Huck) as the other half of the holiday special A Tuna Christmas, and has made previous NFCT appearances as Thomas Cromwell in Wolf Hall and as Stanley Jerome in Broadway Bound. Raised in Mattituck, he has appeared onstage in numerous theatres in Washington, D.C., in Philadelphia, and on Long Island. Some of his other favorite roles include being a featured performer in The Complete Works of William Shakespeare (Abridged), Tartuffe in Tartuffe, Rev. T. Lawrence Shannon in Night of the Iguana, Norman in The Dresser, Sir Toby and Feste in separate productions of Twelfth Night, and George Spelvin in The Actor's Nightmare. He would like to dedicate this production to his father.

DIANE PETERSON (Costumes) — Diane Peterson has been costuming cast members in shows at NFCT since *Sound of Music* back in 2009. She has been a production team member in a combined 60+ shows in the last dozen years for RFCT, Greenport School both High School and Elementary, Southold/Greenport Dramas, and NFCT. She has worked on mostly musicals, but has been fortunate to costume more dramatic endeavors as of late. She thanks the cast and crew for being so easy to work with.

PETER PETERSON (*Production Manager/Lighting*) — Peter is excited to be a part of this amazing production. Peter is incredibly grateful for being able to work with Huck and help him make his vision come to life on stage. Peter also previously designed lights for *A Tuna Christmas* and has been on stage in past NFCT productions including *Wolf Hall* and *Picasso at the Lapin Agile*. KYLE REED (*Laramie Photographer*) — is based in Fort Collins, CO where he lives with his wife and dog. Before his recent move to Colorado, Kyle grew up in Laramie, WY, ultimately graduating from the University of Wyoming. His academic and professional backgrounds are in photography and marketing. His work has been awarded by

the Wyoming Art Council for notable exploration of the medium and meaningful contribution to Wyoming arts. Kyle's work spans genres, but his intention is always to create a space for people to feel seen and valued; a process that is often cathartic for him.

AUTHORS

MOISÉS KAUFMAN — Moisés Kaufman is a Tony and Emmy nominated director and playwright. His play 33 Variations, starring Jane Fonda, was nominated for five Tony awards (including one for Ms. Fonda). Previous to that, Mr. Kaufman directed the Pulitzer and Tony award-winning play I Am My Own Wife, earning him an Obie award for his direction as well as Tony, Drama Desk, Outer Critics Circle, and Lucille Lortel nominations. His plays Gross Indecency: The Three Trials of Oscar Wilde and The Laramie Project have been among the most performed plays in America over the last decade. Mr. Kaufman also directed the film adaptation of The Laramie Project for HBO, which was the opening night selection at the 2002 Sundance Film Festival and won the National Board of Review Award, the Humanitas Prize, and a Special Mention for Best First Film at the Berlin Film Festival. The film also earned Mr. Kaufman two Emmy Award nominations for Best Director and Best Writer. He is the Artistic Director of Tectonic Theater Project and a Guggenheim Fellow in Playwriting. Other credits include Bengal Tiger at the Baghdad Zoo (Mark Taper Forum); Macbeth with Liev Schreiber (Public Theater); This Is How It Goes (Donmar Warehouse); One Arm by Tennessee Williams (Steppenwolf Theater Company); Master Class with Rita Moreno (Berkeley Repertory Theater); and Lady Windermere!s Fan (Williamstown Theater Festival).

GREG PIEROTTI — Greg Pierotti is an associate writer of *The Laramie Project*. He is also co author of *The Laramie Project*: 10 Years Later, and co-writer of *The Laramie Project* teleplay for HBO (2002 Emmy nominee). He is head writer of *The People's Temple* (2005 Glickman Award). His short story "#lude" has been anthologized in #Men to Men: New Voices in Gay Fiction." As an actor he has performed in new and classical work in New York and regionally. He originated roles in the world premieres of THE LARAMIE PROJECT, THE PEOPLE'S TEMPLE, and GROSS INDECENCY: THE THREE TRIALS OF OSCAR WILDE. He teaches English, Writing, and Performance in colleges and MFA programs around the country. He is one of five master teachers of moment work, a technique for writing and developing performance developed by Moisés Kaufman and Tectonic Theater Project. He is currently developing two pieces: a screenplay, #Mineshaft," about the infamous queer sex club of the same name, and a play, MR. APOLOGY, based on transcribed confessions of criminals and wrongdoers of all stripes collected by the artist Allan Bridge in New York during the 1980s. He has been a member of Tectonic Theater Project for over 14 years.

LEIGH FONDAKOWSKI — Leigh Fondakowski was the head writer on *The Laramie Project*, a co writer of *The Laramie Project: Ten Years Later*, and an Emmy-nominated co-screenwriter for the HBO adaptation of *The Laramie Project*. She has been a member of Tectonic since 1994. Her

original works as playwright/director include SPILL (Swine Palace, TimeLine Theater, Ensemble Studio Theatre, 2015 Kilroy List); The People's Temple (Berkeley Repertory Theatre, American Theater Company, the Guthrie Theater, Glickman Award for Best New Play in the Bay Area 2005); and I Think I Like Girls (Encore Theater, Bay Area Critics Circle nomination for Best Production, voted one of the top ten plays of 2002 by the Advocate). Leigh was a 2007 recipient of the NEA/TCG Theatre Residency Program for Playwrights, a 2009 MacDowell Colony Fellow, and a 2010 Distinguished Visiting Chair at the University of Minnesota, where she lectured and developed Casa Cushman, a work-in-progress about nineteenth-century American actress Charlotte Cushman. As director, she headed the national tour of The Laramie Project and Laramie: Ten Years Later, and co-directed The Laramie Cycle with Moisés Kaufman at the Brooklyn Academy of Music. She has directed and developed plays with playwrights Anne Marie Cummings, Colman Domingo, Laura Eason, Julia Jordan, Deb Margolin, Lisa Ramirez, Ellen Gordon Reeves, and Bennett Singer. In 2013, she released her first nonfiction book, #Stories from Jonestown," and she is currently adapting it for film. Leigh is a teaching artist at New Orleans Center for Creative Arts and Naropa University.

STEPHEN BELBER — Stephen Belberls plays have been produced on Broadway and in over 25 countries. They include Match, Tape, Don!t Go Gentle, Dusk Rings a Bell, McReele, Finally, Geometry of Fire, Fault Lines, Carol Mulroney, A Small, Melodramatic Story, One Million Butterflies, The Power of Duf and The Muscles In Our Toes. Theaters where he has been produced include Roundabout, Atlantic, MCC, Primary Stages, Naked Angels, Labyrinth, Rattlestick, The Huntington and The Geffen. He was an Associate Writer on The Laramie Project, and co-writer on The Laramie Project: Ten Years Later. Movies include Tape (directed by Richard Linklater), The Laramie Project (Associate Writer), Drifting Elegant, Management, starring Jennifer Aniston, and Match, starring Patrick Stewart, the last two of which he also directed. Television credits include Rescue Me, Law & Order SVU, O.G., starring Jeffrey Wright, and pilots for F/X, Amazon, The History Channel, FTVS and HBO.

STEPHEN WANGH — Stephen Wangh, has been a playwright, director, and teacher of acting. He is the author of An Acrobat of the Heart, a physical approach to acting inspired by the work of Jerzy Grotowski (Vintage, Random House, 2000) and of The Heart of Teaching: Empowering Students in the Performing Arts (Routledge, 2012). He is the author of 15 plays, and was one of the writers of The People!s Temple (Glickman award: Best play in the Bay Area, 2005). He was Associate Writer for The Laramie Project (Emmy nomination 2002), and dramaturg of Moisés Kaufman!s Gross Indecency, the three trials of Oscar Wilde (1997). For 20 years Steve taught acting in the Experimental Theatre Wing at NYU. Then, for seven years he was Guest Faculty at the MFA Theater: Contemporary Performance program at Naropa University where he taught physical acting and pedagogy. And now? He!s mostly writing, lecturing and leading pedagogy workshops

AUTHOR'S NOTE

The Laramie Project was written through a unique collaboration by Tectonic Theater Project. During the year-and-a-half development of the play, members of the company and I traveled to Laramie six times to conduct interviews with the people of the town. We transcribed and edited the interviews, then conducted several workshops in which the members of the company presented material and acted as dramaturgs in the creation of the play.

As the volume of material grew with each additional trip to Laramie, a small writers! group from within the company began to work closely with me to further organize and edit the material, conduct additional research in Laramie, and collaborate on the writing of the play. This group was led by Leigh Fondakowski as Head Writer, with Stephen Belber and Greg Pierotti as Associate Writers.

As we got closer to the play's first production in Denver, the actors, including Stephen Belber and Greg Pierotti, turned their focus to performance, while Leigh Fondakowski continued to work with me on drafts of the play, as did Stephen Wangh, who by then had joined us as an Associate Writer and #bench coach."

Director's Note

Laramie. An old western town in southeastern Wyoming. One might expect to see the cast of Gunsmoke thickening a plot at the saloon, or a train with its DNA strand of railway cars passing through, moving freshly cut logs for lumber and equipment for farming. These old cliches may seem like mythological stuff from a bygone era, yet much of that culture and ethos persists in the local fabric of this remote city that feels more like a neighborhood.

In preparation for this production, I went to Laramie last October to experience the community 23 years after the brutal killing of Matt Shepard, a college student there. That trauma continues to define, divide and burden the people who live there today. But for many, the incident is also seen as a gut punch that induced meaningful attention and action dealing with difficult issues of diversity and social commitments to positive changes in Laramie, statewide and beyond.

I met people represented in this play. I talked with others familiar with some of them. I shopped in local stores, had beers in local bars, and I visited the site where Matt Shepard was savagely beaten, tied to a fence and left to die. My time there was a deep dive into a horrible nightmare, yet no more or less difficult than the reckoning of this play itself, really. But as Zubaida Ula says in the play: "We need to own this crime. I feel. Everyone needs to own it."

My approach to her mandate is not about guilt, culpability or punishment for the hateful culture and unchecked normative violence that has fueled this kind of wreckage throughout our nation for centuries; but more about healing, understanding and our collective courageous willingness to look at these difficult truths, feel their terrifying weight, and invite the intense, confrontational process of seeing, grieving and ultimately awakening to happen in each of us.

This has been the gift of this project for me (and so many who worked on this production with me), to allow this historical record to resonate beyond the tragic loss of a son, brother, friend; its sparkling lights a meteoric call to action for us all: to make our communities better at living and loving with dignity and justice for all members, not in spite of the undeniable tapestry of differences among us, but because these differences are our strength, beauty and blessing.

Most plays are fictions, forged in the imaginations of playwrights, brought to life in the artful hands of theater collaborators; this play is a poetic reconstruction of the historical record of one community dealing with an unconscionable crime in its own backyard. May our world see less and less of these tragedies, in part because we are more and more willing to own them.

This is The Laramie Project.
