Director's Note:

As the Bard wrote, "some are born great, some achieve greatness, and some have greatness thrust upon 'em." I believe the same notion applies to a musical. Except, I suppose, that no one is born a musical. Anyway, I found myself the director of this show much more by the will of others and circumstance than by will of my own. I nevertheless relish and have thoroughly enjoyed the privilege of taking part in leading what I believe to be a tremendously valuable program for the shaping of young people in our community.

The Youth on Stage program is more than just the NFCT's summer musical. It's an educational program for our community's youth. It's an outlet for creative expression that might otherwise go untapped. It's a forge for the dearest of friendships. It's a home. For ten years, this show has been my home, and I am honored and humbled to have had this opportunity to help lead it. I hope that this program has provided and will provide the altogether magnificent members of this cast the same opportunities it once provided me.

Finally, I'd like to make brief note on this show and race. Race can be a difficult matter to discuss in fiction, and there is an especially sordid history of actors portraying characters of a different race than their own. Any show set in this time period runs the risk of minimizing the very real struggles and tragedies faced by racial minorities therein. In directing this show, one of my main goals was to handle the depiction of any racial group with compassion and dignity. I do not mean to give the impression that any of the characters in this show have much in the way of dignity, but it is my hope that this is the result of their individual characteristics rather than their race.

Thank you all - cast, crew, and audience - for being part of this show.
